Firstly, it is my great pleasure to formally announce that in May, we appointed our new Town Clerk, Katherine Baldwin. Katherine has settled in well and is proactively getting out and about the Town meeting residents and business-owners alike and has already made a tremendous contribution to the work that your Town Council do for our community.

It was fantastic news to hear this middle week in July that the Leeson Road was to be opened and we all know of the hardship that the closure has caused in our Town. I want to thank the various pressure groups, County Councillors and others that have lobbied hard to make this happen, but we must remain vigilant to the dangers of landslip and seek lasting solutions for viable transport links into our town. Our challenge is not over, and we must keep the pressure on local and national government.

We collectively took the decision to offer free car parking on Saturdays during the road closure, as a potential incentive to encourage greater footfall into our Town. The council will have to consider this measure, now that the road is open.

If you want to speak directly with me or the Deputy Mayor (Steph Toogood), then we shall be holding regular surgeries on a Thursday once a month at St. Catherine's Church, Ventnor. We welcome your views and input in shaping our community. Please come along and say hello.

We are in the final planning stage for the Community Orchard, which will be in Steephill Down Road. It is hoped that tree planting will go ahead in late October/early November of this year, when there will be an opening ceremony. Further details to follow.

Lastly, I have met several times with local businesses over the course of the last year and I am delighted to have played a small part in supporting the various businesses through constructive dialogue. Local businesses are now near to forming their own Ventnor Business Association and Ventnor Town Council wish the group all good wishes and profitable endeavour.

Organisations invited include Citizen's Advice, Age UK, Southern Water, Health Watch, Diabetes Group IOW, Living Well & Early Help, Veterans Outreach Support, Sight for Wight, Baby Box Isle of Wight, Green IOW, Solutions4Health and our local PCSO. There will also be a Mayor's Surgery drop-in session with either Steve Cooper (Mayor) or Steph Toogood (Deputy Mayor) from 12.30-1.30pm.

Next dates are August 1st and September 5th, 2024.

Many thanks to the congregation and Church Wardens at St. Catherine's Church for supporting and hosting the event.

There will be free tea, coffee and cake and the opportunity to talk to representatives of these organisations to access support or have an informal chat. It's a chance to meet with groups and agencies that don't have a permanent base in Ventnor.

The event also includes our weekly Thursday Kitchen. A group of volunteers have come together to offer a free lunch every Thursday as a part of the Town Council's Warm Spaces scheme. This has been running every week since the beginning of 2023.

St. Catherine's Warm Space is also open for coffee, tea and cake, every Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday 10:30 to 12:30, it is free, and donations are appreciated.

The answer is no. The Town Councillors do not receive payment or an allowance. The confusion often arises when a Town Councillor is also a County Councillor on the Isle of Wight Council. A County Councillor will receive an allowance which varies depending on their responsibilities but they do not receive an allowance from Ventnor Town Council.



Ventnor Town Council are delighted to announce that we have secured funding to provide additional services for the no 31 Bus. The service will continue to operate on its current route, servicing St Lawrence and Bonchurch Village, via Ventnor Boots and will now provide an additional journey on the Tuesdays and Fridays and also operate for 4 journeys on Saturday mornings. We hope that this will support the transport needs of Bonchurch residents, following the closure of Leeson Road and be an improved service for St Lawrence residents. Youth Group Update

The children took part in the Extraordinary Earth Project by StudentsRebuild, where they created artwork inspired by our world; nature and animals. For every piece of art submitted, the Bezo's Family Foundation donated \$5 to organisations tackling climate change and protecting our earth.

The children loved sharing their knowledge of endangered animals and the planet as well as ideas on how to protect it and what they can do to contribute at home. They donated \$230!

The children experimented and created art with chalk and oil pastels, paint splatter trees in the style of Jackson Pollock and also made clay hedgehogs. They made flower-scapes on clay tiles by imprinting various pasta shapes and using modelling tools. Those who took part received a certificate and should feel very proud of their conscientious conservation efforts.
