Ventnor Well-Being Café

What an amazing year we had in 2024, including trips all over the Island and to the mainland, making decorations for the Town during Carnival Week, a fabulous Christmas lunch at the Mill Bay and a Christmas party with the biggest pass-the-parcel you've ever seen! In December we spent a very cold day in Winchester visiting the Christmas Market. It was great to see the spectacular Cathedral and all the beautiful Christmas decorations around the town. On Fridays we have a fabulous volunteer, Juile, who helps Terri to cook and serve over 20 meals to the group. We are indebted to her for all the hard work she puts in and the poignant and often funny readings, quizzes and games she brings along.

Everyone is welcome to come along to Well-being Café. It is a support group for people to help them overcome mental health challenges, social isolation and loneliness, grief and physical health problems such as chronic pain. It is a warm welcoming place to meet new people, share experiences and connect with the local community. We have members aged from 18-88 and some fabulous canine friends that attend with their well-behaved owners!

Meetings at the Green Room include chatting over a cuppa, bingo and quizzes, colouring, knitting and other crafts, playing with gadgets such as a VR headset, puzzles and board games. We also have regular visits from outreach workers from Living Well and Early Help Service who give support and advice on all sorts of issues including finances, benefits and housing.







Really Useful Thursdays

On Thursday 6th February from 10.30 am to 1.30 pm, Ventnor Town Council and partner agencies will be at our monthly 'Really Useful Thursdays' session at St. Catherine's Church. Previously called 'Ventnor Our Place', the event brings together groups from the local voluntary and community sector with Island-wide agencies. Organizations invited include Citizens Advice, Age UK, Southern Water, Health Watch, Diabetes Group IOW, Living Well & Early Help, Veterans Outreach Support, Sight for Wight, Baby Box Isle of Wight, Green IOW, Solutions4Health and our local PCSO. There will also be a Mayor's Surgery drop-in session with either Steve Cooper (Mayor) or Steph Toogood (Deputy Mayor) from 12.30-1.30pm.

Many thanks to the congregation and Church Wardens at St. Catherine's Church for supporting and hosting the event.

There will be free tea, coffee and cake and the opportunity to talk to representatives of these organizations to access support or have an informal chat. It's a chance to meet with groups and agencies that don't have a permanent base in Ventnor.

The event also includes our weekly Thursday Kitchen. A group of volunteers have come together to offer a free lunch every Thursday as a part of the Town Council's Warm Spaces scheme. This has been running every week since the beginning of 2023.

St. Catherine's Warm Space is also open for coffee, tea and cake, every Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday 10:30 to 12:30; it is free, and donations are appreciated.



Achievement Awards for all ages

The provision of a UKA dance teacher provides Achievement Awards for all ages if the participants are interested.

There will be a related event happening in the year that will give young people aged 16 and over the opportunity to receive an accredited qualification in dance and leading classes and workshops. The training will also feature Just Jhoom (wellbeing, movement and physical exercise).

The qualification will provide: volunteers; young people; youth and community workers; sports coaches and leaders interested in dance and activity provision, with ideas for basic dance moves and fun ways to introduce dance to young people within their community.

What to expect

Aims of the qualification workshop:

- To understand basic dance movements needed to participate
- Explore the basic elements of Street Dance, cheerleading and Just Jhoom (wellbeing, movement and physical exercise)
- Deliver basic dance activities to groups of young people and understand adaptations and developments that can be made to develop dance and/or activities.

After the course, participants will be able to introduce dance activities to young people in a community setting or Doorstep Sport Club.

Young people aged 16+ interested in leading sport, community sport project leaders, youth work and leadership, coaches and volunteers.

No. 31 Bus - Ventnor's Community Bus Service

As many of you will know, Ventnor Town Council supports the provision of the No 31 Community Bus route that provides a service to St Lawrence and Bonchurch villages on Tuesday and Friday mornings. For the last 6 months we have been able to extend this Service for an additional hour and also to run on Saturday mornings. The Bus picks up at various points and starts / terminates at Ventnor Boots, where a detailed timetable is available. This additional service will continue for the next 18 months and we hope that you and others will continue to use it. The journeys cost £2.50 each way or is **free to Concessionary Bus Pass holders**. The service was welcomed by Bonchurch users whilst Leeson Road was closed and we hope that more residents will take advantage of the service.

The current service uses 8 and 16-seater buses and is quite flexible in terms of pick-up and drop-off points between bus stops. The routes undertaken are not provided for by Southern Vectis. Ventnor Town Council is happy to receive any feedback that current users of the No 31 bus service may have.

Ventnor Town Council will publish the Statement of Persons Nominated and the Declaration of Result both on the Ventnor Town Council noticeboard by Spring Hill Gardens and on the website. However, the Town Council does not publish details about candidates other than the information on the Statement of Persons Nominated.

Governance Update

The Town Council has, this year, introduced new committees of councillors, to deal with business in between meetings of the whole council. These replace the former working parties. The new committees are: Policy & Resources, Environment & Transport, Business & Community, Planning, and Buildings Maintenance. All the meetings are open to the public, except where they are dealing with confidential items.

Cllr Ian Bond, who led development of the proposals working with the Mayor and other members, said: "These changes will ensure that most council decisions are now taken in public, with proper agenda papers, and a written record published on the council's website. They also offer residents another way to raise issues or comment on decisions, before they are made, in a more informal setting than at the bi-monthly full council meetings".
